

HOW PRODUCTIVE IS YOUR TEAM?

Add up your score - A= 2; U= 1; S = 0

- 18-24 Congratulations to your team! Your group members have good interpersonal skills. You are good at working together.
- 10-17 Your team members can cooperate and communicate sometimes but you have difficulty resolving conflict and depending on each other.
- 0-9 Your team members usually avoid discussing the real problems in your group because of extensive, unresolved conflicts. Group members have had little training in effective communication or learning how to cooperate. Group productivity is often sabotaged by hidden agendas or lack of trust.
